E. Approval of Minutes

1. Minutes from the June 2, 2026 Called Meeting and the June 9, 2026 Regular Meeting

District 2 Commissioner Smith motioned to approve the June 2, 2026 Called Meeting Minutes and the June 9, 2026 Regular Meeting Minutes. District 1 Commissioner Deering seconded. Motion passed 5 - 0.

F. Business Items

1. Consideration of a Budget Adjustment - 911 Fund

District 1 Commissioner Deering motioned to approve the quote as presented with Priority Dispatch and to use 911 Fund salaries line items to fund the professional services expense. District 3 Commissioner Lindsey seconded. Motion passed 5 - 0.

2. Consideration of a Hangar Space Pad Lease with Arcovia Air, LLC.

District 3 Commissioner Lindsey motioned to approve the lease with Arcovia Air, LLC. District 4 Commissioner Blanton seconded. Motion passed 5 - 0.

3. Consideration of the Senior Center Meals Contract

District 3 Commissioner Lindsey motioned to approve contract between the Greene County Senior Center and G.A. Food Services of Pinellas County, Inc. for the provision of meals for the Senior Center. District 1 Commissioner Deering seconded. Motion passed 5 - 0.

4. Consideration of an Intergovernmental Agreement - Arena

District 1 Commissioner Deering motioned to approve the Intergovernmental Agreement with the Georgia Department of Agriculture for Arena improvements. District 3 Commissioner Lindsey seconded. Motion passed 5 - 0.

5. Consideration of a Budget Adjustment - Ventilators

District 4 Commissioner Blanton motioned to approve the purchase of six ventilators for the ambulances using Hospital Fund fund balance. District 3 Commissioner Lindsey seconded. Motion passed 5 - 0.

6. Consideration of a SPLOST Purchase - Brush Truck

District 2 Commissioner Smith motioned to approve the purchase of a 2009 Ford F450 truck with vin ending in 8949 from Walker Church Fire Department, Inc. at a purchase price of \$35,000 using SPLOST VII funds. District 1 Commissioner Deering seconded. Motion passed 5 - 0.

7. Consideration of a SPLOST Project - Woodville Fire Station

District 1 Commissioner Deering motioned to approve the project to purchase furnishings and related items for Woodville Station 4 at an estimated cost of \$15,800 using SPLOST VII funds. District 2 Commissioner Smith seconded. Motion passed 5 - 0.

District 4 Commissioner Blanton motioned to approve Resolution 2026.7.14(b) expressing support for the expansion of St Mary's Good Samaritan Hospital, and to waive the reading of the Resolution. District 1 Commissioner Deering seconded. Motion passed 5 - 0.
